Hand Dryers

Benefits

- Pays for themselves after two years and saves money thereafter.
- Saves trees.
- Decreases pollution.
- Limits bacteria and germs spread.
- Keeps trash level low.
- Helps qualify as a LEED certified school.

Paper Towels

Drawbacks

- Central Middle School spends approximately \$5,600 on paper towels annually.
- Constant replacement is needed.
- More time spent on maintenance.
- More chance of vandalism.
- Daily trash pick up.
- Environmentally detrimental.

Overview

HAND DRYERS

- Studies show a significant reduction in sickness at schools.
- 95% minimum cost savings.
- We won't have to pay companies to keep coming to pick up our trash everyday.

PAPER TOWELS

- 1 ton of paper uses:
- 7,000 gallons of water.
- 17 full grown trees.
- 464 gallons of oil.
- 3 yards of landfill space.
- Constantly need to be replaced.

- Study other school and business hand dryer models.
- Prepare presentation of dryer model options.
- Report back to Board of Education at May 2013 Meeting.
