

Every Student Has a Job

We are starting our class jobs this week. There are 12 class jobs in the Bee class which are assigned to the students each week. New jobs are assigned on Monday and continue throughout the week. Each job has an important role in the classroom. On the weeks your child does not have a job, he/she is "on vacation". Here is the list of our jobs followed by a brief description.



Best Bee – This student plays our special instrument to indicate that it is circle time.

Bag Carrier – The student is responsible for carrying the small backpack with our first aid supplies when we leave the classroom.

Caboose – This is the child at the end of the line. They make sure that we all get where we need to go.

Calendar Helper – The child assists with the calendar activity at circle time. He/she moves correct pattern piece to the block for the day of the week.

Door Holder – This child holds open the outside door and any other door in the building until the entire class goes through.

Floor Inspector – This person checks the floors at the completion of clean up time. He/she carries a small hand broom and dust pan to sweep up any remaining small items for the trash.

Light Monitor– This is the child that turns off the lights and gives the class a two minute warning that we will clean up and then tells us that it is time to clean up.

Line Leader– This person is at the front of the line leading us to the playground, gym or restroom.

Number Counter– This student counts the number of children present for the day during circle time. After he/she counts, Ms. Julie writes the number on the SMARTboard.

Schedule Keeper– This person helps move the daily activities into the correct schedule on the SMARTboard during circle time.

Snack Helper – This child is the person passes out napkins and other snack items on the table for each child.

Song Leader – This student selects the first song we sing during our closing circle at the end of the day.

Weather Grapher– This child places the weather conditions for the day into the graph used on the SMARTboard at circle time. (This job does not start until later in the school year)

Weather Reporter– This child looks out the window and determines the weather conditions. The corresponding weather icons are moved into the weather statement box on the SMARTboard and the weather sentence is read to the class.
